



# Honoring Our Heroes



Fort Mill South Carolina Veterans Committee and the Town of Fort Mill are proud to honor all who have served our country in any of the five uniformed services: Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and Coast Guard (including the Reserves and National Guard) in the Town's Veterans Park.

Veterans Park is prominently located on North White Street and is surrounded by green space. The park is in easy walking distance of Millstone Park, Confederate Park, Walter Elisha Park and downtown Fort Mill.

The park's centerpiece is an 8-foot tall pedestal topped by a World War I Doughboy. The pedestal is engraved with the names of fallen Fort Mill servicemen and women. Five granite walls in the shape of a five-point star represent the five branches of the uniformed services.

A "Walk of Honor" was created using custom pavers that can be purchased by the public. These pavers honor loved ones and serve as an endearing memorial to those who have served.

Pavers are placed in the park on Veterans Day and Memorial Day. The public can then view the new pavers at the Town of Fort Mill's observances of these holidays held at Veterans Park.
